



- Increase CWP involvement/participation in the ECH Sub-Group









- Past meeting costs have been meet by DECC, DEHWR, DAA, ICC













Updates on each Regional Priority

Ngunnhu Fishtraps (Brewarrina):

- DEHWR funded & endorsed CMP
- Creation of a partnership management group between Commonwealth, State & Local Govt; Brewarrina Business Centre & Aboriginal Community
- \$150,000 grant provided by DEHWR to implement CMP
- Employment of Site Manager
- Need to simplify land management arrangements









River Health:

- Western CMA Riparian Management through its incentive programs (fencing, revegetation, Aboriginal sites conservation)
- DECC submission under Commonwealth 'Caring for Our Country' funding – Project 'Renewing Aboriginal community access to rivers'
- MDBC Proposal to establish an indigenous advisory committee for the Darling River catchment similar to MLDRIN
- Western CMA to consider expansion of river monitoring program









River Health Con't:

- NSW DWE proposing to develop a Darling River Management Plan. Need for strong Aboriginal community input into the Plan
- Western CMA conducted a canoe trip between Brewarrina & Bourke which promoted the different issues along the river
- Need for a strong partnership across boarder with Queensland
- Need for Aboriginal communities to get the real story (what has happened over the past 20 years) with the river
- Re-snagging of river for improved fish habitat

Collarenebri Carved Trees:

- Objective of Aboriginal community to have over 50 Carved trees taken in 1947 returned back to country and placed into a secured building
- Support provided to a delegation from community to the National Museum and National Library
- Meeting held with community to raise issues such as purchase of land, feasibility study to construct a keeping place, field visit to museums
- E-Sub application to undertake a field visit of Adelaide & Melbourne Museums where trees are currently held









Recording Significant Sites/Places:

- Information provided on the Commonwealth & State heritage registers and how significant sites/places may be recorded and entered
- Information provided on current National Heritage Listings, State Heritage Register and DECC AHIMS Register
- Information recorded by DECC on Aboriginal Living Places (Mission, Reserves, Fringe Camps)
- Various funding available to manage listed sites/places









Oral Histories:

- Aboriginal elders oral histories are an important record to future generations
- It identifies people, places and events
- Examples of oral histories (archives in AIATSIS) and DECC booklets
- Utilise existing groups who have set up structures
- E-Sub application for a broader Oral Histories project across the region
- ICC through contingency funding to provide \$25,000 to support purchase of equipment and training of community members









Language:

- Identified as a key element that relates back to identity
- All Aboriginal communities should have reasonable access to the local Aboriginal language and also provision of information in relation to their own cultural language (from where they have come from)
- DAA NSW Aboriginal Languages Policy (Support through the NSW Aboriginal Languages Research & Resource Centre)
- DECC Co-Naming Policy









Boundaries:

- Various mapped boundaries have been provided to CWP members
- These have been derived from Tindale and other map forms
- Map by former DNR (copy to be distributed at Regional Assembly) – need for feedback to DECC









Cemeteries:

- A number of CWP's have identified work to be carried out on Aboriginal cemeteries
- Provision of a spreadsheet of Aboriginal recorded graves / cemeteries in NSW
- Need to identify key cemeteries that require urgent action and align funding arrangements
